Warning: It is an offence under the Immigration Law for any person to make, cause or allow to be made any return, statement or representation which is false in a material particular and which he knows to be false or which he does not believe to be true. A person found guilty of this offence is liable on summary conviction in respect of a first offence, to a fine of \$5,000.00 and to imprisonment for one year or, in respect of a second or subsequent offence, to a fine of ten thousand dollars and to imprisonment for two years.

By making an application for a work permit, you agree to cooperate with the Chief Immigration Officer/Work Permit Board ("the Board") or its duly appointed agents by providing such information or documents as they may reasonably request in connection with your application.

If the Chief Immigration Officer or the Board has reasonable grounds to believe that any fact stated in any application for a work permit (including any affidavit sworn in support of such application) is false in a material particular, the Chief Immigration Officer or the Board or its duly appointed agents may conduct a full investigation in such manner as it deems fit.
