Note*
The current Immigration Law defines "settled", in relation to a person residing in the Islands, as a person who-
(a) is legally and ordinarily resident in the Islands;
(b) is not subject to any immigration restriction or control on the duration of his stay in the Islands; and
(c) has not voluntarily emigrated with the intention of making his home elsewhere.
The 1971 Cayman Protection Law defines "domiciled" and its derivatives as having the meaning ordinarily applied to those expressions at common law.
The 1984 Cayman Protection Law defines "domicile" and its derivatives as having the meaning ordinarily applied to those expressions at common law:
PROVIDED that wheresoever the word "domicile" or its derivatives appear in paragraphs (a) and (b) of section 15 of the Caymanian Protection Law, 1971, or in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1) of section 15 of the Caymanian Protection Law (Revised), then the provision of subsection (3) of section 15 of the Caymanian Protection Law (Revised) shall apply for the purpose of construing and interpreting the word "domicile" and its derivatives
The 2000, 2001 & 2003 Immigration Laws define "domiciled" and its derivatives as having, subject to subsection (2), the meaning ordinarily applied to those expressions at common law:
PROVIDED that wheresoever the word "domicile" or its derivatives appear in paragraphs (a) and (b) of section 15 of the previously repealed law, then section 15(3) of the previously repealed law shall apply for the purpose of construing and interpreting the word "domicile" and its derivatives.
The current Immigration Law does not define "domiciled".

Warning: It is an offence for any person to make, cause or allow to be made any return, statement or representation which is false in a material particular and which he knows to be false or which he does not believe to be true. A person found guilty of this offence is liable on summary conviction in respect of a first offence to a fine of CI \$5,000.00 and to imprisonment for one year or, in respect of a second or subsequent offence to a fine of CI \$10,000 and to imprisonment for two years.

- Proof of Legal and Ordinary Residence**
A copy of the permission letter for child to remain in the Islands issued by the Chief Immigration Officer, or
A copy of the work permit letter naming the child as a dependant, or
A Copy of the Permanent Residence/Residency & Employment Rights Certificate naming the child as a dependant, or
A copy of the Certificate of the Government contract naming the child as a dependant.
- Evidence of Marital Status**
All male parents who are applying for their child to be acknowledged through them, who are/were married to the birth mother at the time of the child's birth, must provide a notarized/certified copy of marriage certificate.
- DNA Test**
All male parents who are applying for their child to be acknowledged through them and who were **not** married to the birth mother at the time of the child's birth must obtain a DNA and submit the **original** results with the application.
DNA tests will only be accepted from the Cayman Islands, the USA and the United Kingdom.
- Proof of Identity**
Clear copy of photo and information page of Caymanian parent and child's passport
Notarized/certified copy of birth certificate of child.

Permission for a child to enter, remain and attend school is required when a parent has been granted Cayman Status and the child has not been legally and ordinary resident in the islands for a period of not less than one year.

This permission may be obtained by submitting Form R21.

All male parents who are applying for their child to be acknowledged through them and who were **not** married to the birth mother at the time of the child's birth must obtain a DNA and submit the **original** results with the application.
DNA tests will only be accepted from the Cayman Islands, the USA and the United Kingdom.
- Proof of Identity**
Clear copy of photo and information page of both parents' and child's passport
Notarized/certified copy of birth certificate of applicant
Adoption - Notarized/certified copy of Adoption Papers (if applicable)
- Affidavit**
