(2015 REVISION)**

THE IMMIGRATION (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) REGULATIONS, 2017

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In exercise of the powers conferred by section 99(1) and (2)(f) of the Immigration Law (2015 Revision), the Cabinet makes the following Regulations -

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Immigration (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 2017. Citation

2. The Immigration Regulations (2015 Revision) are amended in regulation 20 as follows - Amendment of regulation 20 of the Immigration Regulations (2015 Revision) - production of visas
 - (a) in subregulation (1)(b) by deleting the words “Bulgaria” and “Romania”;
 - (b) by inserting after subregulation (1), the following subregulation -
 - “(1A) Notwithstanding subregulation (1), where a national of Jamaica or China (People’s Republic) -
 - (a) possesses a valid visa from the United States of America, Canada, or the United Kingdom; and
 - (b) arrives in the Islands directly from the country for which that visa was issued,that national may be permitted to enter and remain in the Islands for a period not exceeding thirty days.”; and

- (c) by deleting subregulation (3) and substituting the following subregulation -

“(3) A transit passenger who is a national of any of the countries listed below is required to have a visa upon arrival in the Islands -

unless the transit passenger is arriving for any of the following purposes -

- (a) to join a cruise ship as a crew member within twenty-four hours of arrival;
- (b) to disembark from a cruise ship in the Islands in order to transfer to another cruise ship or to leave from the Islands by air within twenty-four hours of arrival;

- (c) to repair equipment or carry out engineering services as referred to in regulation 11(2)(p) for a period of not more than twenty-four hours; and
- (d) as an operational crew member of a commercial airline.”.
